Silhouettes

Mammal *Silhouettes* provide a quick life-sized reference for some common mammals with identifiable physical characteristics. One of the first clues to identification is size. These silhouettes give a real-life reference. Recognizing the posture and placement of a correctly sized animal helps to create confidence by building the correct search image.

Search Image

When placed or displayed in a location that mimics the behavior of the mammal, you are creating the correct search image. For example, with similar sized mammals, you are likely to find a marmot on the ground, and a gray squirrel up in a tree.

Field Guides

Field guides provide references to important diagnostic features, range, behavior and call. These silhouettes are designed as learning tools to be used in conjunction with field guides.

The *NatureMapping* students of the Hood Canal Institute create these silhouettes at the Theler Wetlands. These North Mason students were looking for a way to assist all wetland visitors in identifying the mammals of the region. They are made of durable recycled x-ray film.
