Through much of the history of ancient Egypt, Saqqara was a sacred site. While there were many human burials in the area, there were hundreds of thousand of mummified animals buried there as well. Based on his studies and explorations, this amazing phenomenon will be examined by Dr. Dodson.

*About the speaker:*

**Dr. Aidan Dodson** is a professor of Egyptology at the University of Bristol, where he is a senior research fellow in the Department of Archaeology and Anthropology. He earned his PhD at the University of Cambridge in 1995. Dr. Dodson is the author of several books, including *Amarna Sunset* and *Poisoned Legacy: The Fall of the Nineteenth Egyptian Dynasty*. In addition, he has authored over 200 papers, articles and reviews. He currently is a contributing editor at *KMT: A Modern Journal of Egyptology*.
