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# Currently in the FLRC

- Film collection (~2,500 films)
- Equipment checkout
- Classroom/lab space
- Event space



Large film collection w/heavy circulation

Now less, online streaming, campus based streaming service

Equipment checkout (cameras)

Now less, cameras become obsolete (assortment of 480p, 720p, 1080p)

encouraging the use of current cellphones (problem audio quality + vertical video)

Some faculty prefer flips, but battery usage life low (rechargeable packs have long since died), no current replacements that are simple to use like flip

Usage

Language department events (Kaffee & Kuchen),

Some Language class usage mostly for internet research

Heavy usage by TAs/LRs due to requirement of a technology project for course
