The course will examine similarities and differences between U.S. and Quebec cities. We will look more particularly at current urban issues confronting communities in Canada. We will study the physical layout of cities, urban design, and urban growth, problems related to the environment, governmental institutions as well as historical, social and cultural factors specific to Quebec cities. Students will write a paper on a topic related to urban issues encountered in Canada. Cities to be visited are Montreal and Quebec City. The estimated cost of the trip: \$1,000 (\$200/300 scholarships are available to any student who completes the program and provides the UW Canadian Studies Center with a short report. Students pay for airfare, meals and lodging and ground transportation in addition to tuition. Personal items are your responsibility.
