 - Outpatient

CLERKSHIP ACTIVITIES

- OFFICE
 - Interview and Examine Patients (Pelvic & Breast Exams, Pap Smears)
 - Observe or assist with office procedures (colposcopy, endometrial biopsy, D&C)
- OR
 - Participate in GYN surgeries and Cesarean Sections
- L&D
 - Evaluate patients in triage
 - Observe, assist, or perform vaginal & cesarean deliveries
- INPATIENT
 - Round on patients and participate in their hospitalization
