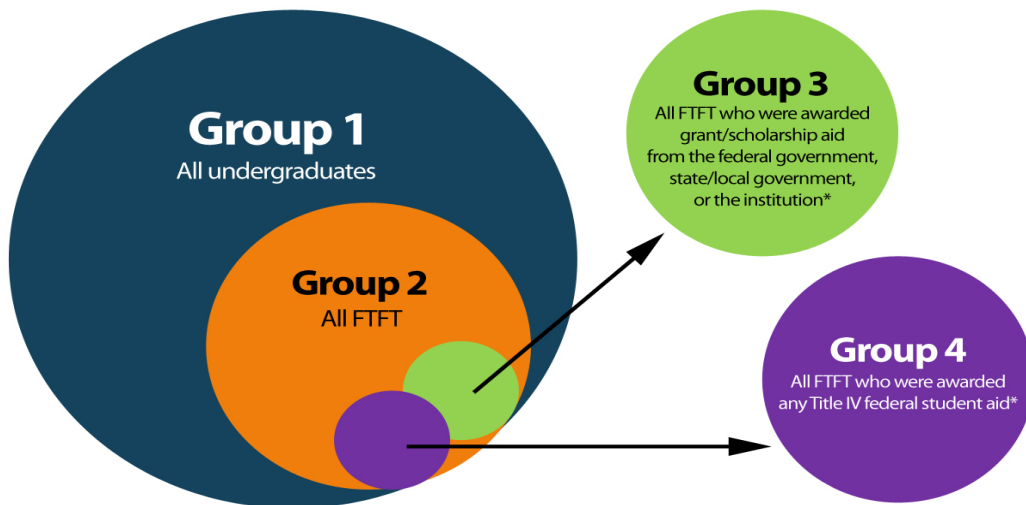

COA Revisions

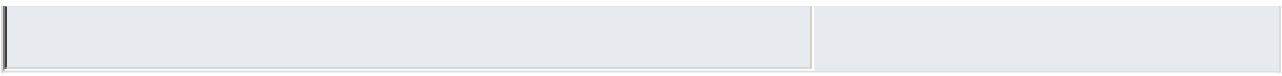
