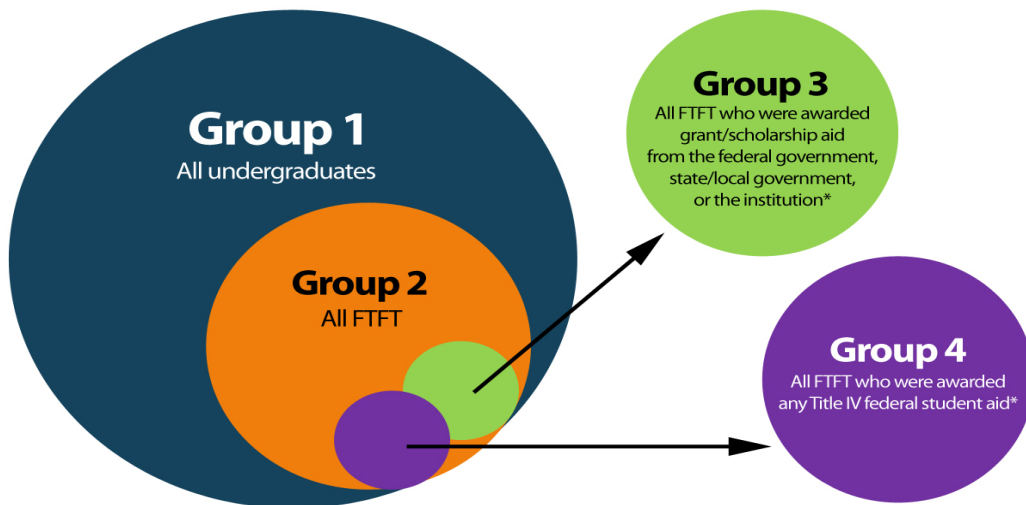

COA Revisions

Revisions to Cost of Attendance used to calculate the net price of attendance can be made in this component.

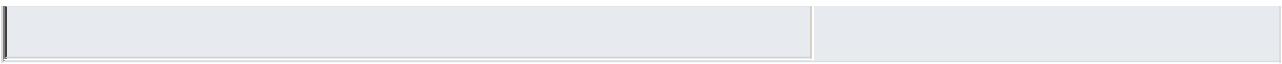
