CAVEAT STATEMENTS

2011

1. We don't show entering undergrads by discipline. We don't do many direct admits to majors, so that doesn't apply to us. 2. The issue of distinguishing students entering at the Masters vs Doctoral level is a bit problematic. Students are admitted into a program that is expected to lead to a doctoral degree, but they may leave with a masters degree. Moreover, it depends on the department whether such a student is coded as a predoctoral student on entry, as a masters student until they get receive a masters degree, etc. So we've decided that the most accurate thing to do is to classify any student entering a program where they may receive a doctoral degree to be a doctoral student. We believe the only other approach open to me severely understates the number of entering doctoral students we have. 3. You'll see that I haven't (we can't do it well) broken out institutional income by discipline. 4. Research Income is a bit difficult for us, given our information systems. We are better able to report research expenditures. This information is based on award information, and so the year-to-year changes are a bit more volatile than if we were reporting on expenditures.
