Matt Neeley is the Transportation Director for Park City, Utah. Matt oversees the city's transportation system, which includes Transit, Transportation Planning, Parking, and Traffic Operations. The city has a population of 8,000 and a seasonal peak of nearly six million visitors over approximately 11.35 square miles. Park City is one of the nation's top recreational destinations for winter and summer sports. The city offers free transit service through the city and operates a transit fleet of 40 vehicles utilizing both diesel and electric buses. The transit system carries approximately 2 million passengers a year, with 2/3 of the ridership occurring over 4 months of the year.

I was raised in Utah and moved to Washington State in 2000 to work for the Washington State Department of Transportation. Before moving from Washington in May of 2022, I worked as the State Traffic Systems Development Engineer and was responsible for Traffic Operations Electrical Systems, WSDOT'S Major Electrical Asset Management Program, and Commercial Vehicle Services oversize and Overweight Permitting and Weigh station systems.

Before coming to WSDOT, Matt worked as a consulting engineer for five years in Salt Lake City, Utah, after he graduated with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Utah. After moving to Washington, Matt attended Saint Martin's University and earned a master's degree in Civil Engineering.
