A Labor Archive will preserve the records of unions and of labor leaders and activists, and will serve as a center for historical research. Such research will help new generations understand the importance of the labor movement in the past and its importance to the future.

The Labor Archive will be part of the UW Special Collections Library. It will be managed by a professional labor archivist employed by the Bridges Center. The labor archivist will supervise the development of the archive, advise unions on records management and donations, and will develop educational projects and materials that will be widely accessible to union members, schools, and the general public.
