Minimum grades for individual School of Pharmacy courses and course series to apply toward the Doctor of Pharmacy degree requirements (effective 2008-2009 academic year). Please consult <http://depts.washington.edu/pha/students/handbook/2008/e.pdf> for additional information on student progression.

PHARM 500 courses and courses with 500 P in the course title -1.7 minimum grade
500 MEDCH P in the course title - 0.7 minimum grade
500 PCEUT P in the course title - 0.7 minimum grade

For other 400 level courses (e.g., CONJ, PHCOL, MEDCH 400) - 0.7 minimum grade

Exceptions:

PHARM 500 P-Quantitative Methods I (minimum 2.7 grade beginning with the Class of 2011; in prior years the minimum grade was 2.0)

PHARM 504 P-Pharmacy Practice (minimum 2.7 grade beginning with the Class of 2011; in prior years the minimum grade was 2.0)

PHARM 512 P-Human Behavior and Communication in Pharmacy (minimum 2.7 grade beginning with the Class of 2011)

PHARM 560-565 Pharmacotherapeutics lecture and labs (2.0 GPA in the series)

PHARM 587 85% or above on all calculation exams

The minimum grades for courses to apply toward certificate requirements is 2.7. Please refer to the individual certificate program's website or contact persons for other specific requirements of the programs.

Students must maintain a minimum 2.00 cumulative professional and University GPA to remain in good standing as a Pharm.D. student.
