The *final document* should be well referenced - all facts and claims should be cited. Use any of the Citation Guides available on:

For the *outline*, provide citations to support key facts and claims.

Citations should be self-explanatory. For instance, a citation of 21CFR1305.25 should also include the section title. The correct citation would be:

21CFR1306.25 Transfer between pharmacies of prescription information for Schedules III, IV, and V controlled substances for refill purposes.

For each of the items in the outline below, provide two or three **summary sentences**. Note that this is a rough guide and may not be applicable to some projects. Adapt as necessary to produce a persuasive document.

- I. Introduction and Summary <summarize the problem with existing law and your proposed alternative>
- II. Problem definition
- III. Language of proposed law
- IV. Evaluation of alternatives
  - A. Evaluation criteria
  - B. Alternatives to existing law
  - C. Stakeholders
- V. Conclusions

Note: if you are creating new or modifying existing language in USC, CFR, RCW or WAC, or a Guideline, please use the following conventions for displaying your proposed language:

- Nest the language within a couple of paragraphs of existing language to provide context if appropriate
- ~~Strike out~~ language to be deleted<sup>2</sup>
- Underline language to be added

<sup>1</sup>In Word 2007, select References, then Insert Footnote, then enter or paste the citation. In earlier versions of Word, select View, then Footnote, then enter or paste the citation. <CTRL><ALT>f works in both.
