The class begins with ancient period and concludes with present. The class examines the development of specialization in sports medicine, sport team physicians, preventive medicine, concepts of fitness and wellness as related to exercise prescription, and sports medicine clinics.

Instruction will be accomplished through informal lecture and discussion, backed by reading in original sources. Medical training is not a prerequisite, and previous college courses in the sciences or history are not essential. Fulfills I&S requirement.
