THIRD YEAR ROTATION INSPIRES

Third year osteopathic medical student Allison Jarstad had no idea how much she would love surgery. The following describes her experience while training under the guidance of Chair of the Department of Surgery and Adjunct Clinical Faculty member, Jason Cundiff, MD.

"It is an incredible feeling to be a part of solving specific medical problems and saving lives. During rounds, Dr. Cundiff expects students to participate in interviews with patients and assist in determining a diagnosis and postoperative treatment plan. In doing so, we are pushed to think like doctors.

In the operating room, students participate from initial incision to closing, and classroom pathology provides precisely what students need to know for the various surgeries performed. Dr. Cundiff's non-profit organization, Pacific Northwest Surgical Outreach in Haiti, provides me the opportunity to utilize skills from the classroom and the clinical rotation for one week, where I will continue to assist with surgeries and manage patients' immediate postoperative care as part of my surgical training.

I have learned more during the last four weeks from the hands-on experience with Dr. Cundiff than I ever could from solely reading a surgical textbook."
