Dr. Cathy King started World Vets with a donation jar at her office in Deer Park, Wash., in 2006. Today, the nonprofit's volunteer veterinarians have treated animals in 36 countries around the world, from flood-ravaged Thailand to low-income neighborhoods in Central America.

"It's really a concrete thing that we have changed so it's so rewarding," said King, whose nonprofit is now headquartered in Fargo, N.D.
