Biobanks and other clinical data repositories have changed "business as usual" for researchers and for research oversight. Our speaker is **Dr. Kelly Edwards**, Associate Professor, Bioethics & Humanities, Adjunct Associate Professor, Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences and Core Faculty, Institute for Public Health Genetics. Dr. Edwards special interests include community-based research practices, biobank governance, environmental justice, everyday ethics in research practice, feminist and narrative approaches to bioethics, and integrating ethics into training programs, public conversations about science, and public policy.
