Ellen 't Hoen, lawyer and independent consultant in medicine policy and law, specializes in access to medicines and intellectual property. She established and served as Executive Director of the Medicines Patent Pool, funded by UNITAID, with the mission to improve the health of people living with HIV in low- and middle-income countries by increasing access to life-saving medicines. Before establishing the Medicines Patent Pool, Ellen 't Hoen was Director of Policy and Advocacy for the Médecins sans Frontières' (MSF) Campaign for Access to Essential Medicines (1999-2009).

She has been listed numerous times as one of the 50 most influential people in intellectual property in the world by the journal *Managing Intellectual Property*, and she authored the book *The Global Politics of* Pharmaceutical Monopoly Power (2009).
