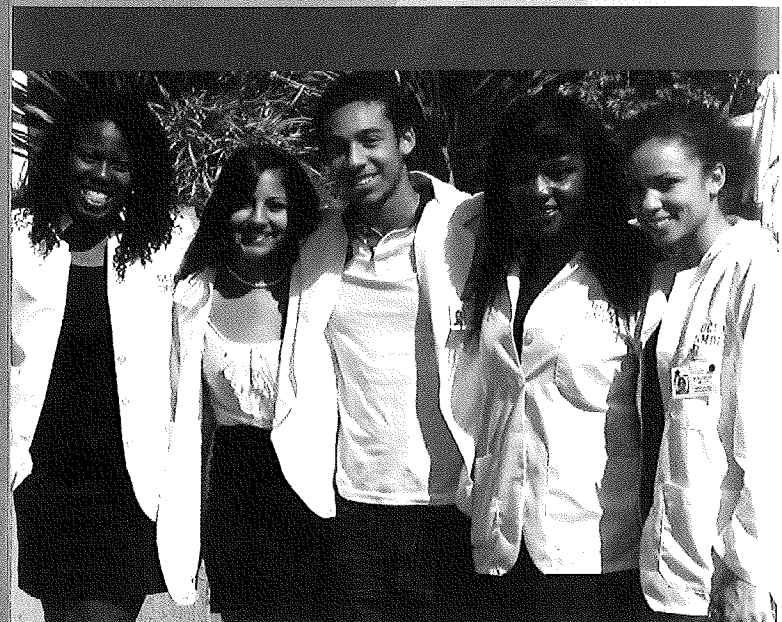

To be eligible for SMDEP, an applicant must:

- Be a college freshman or sophomore.

Other factors that are considered include that a student:

- identifies with a group that is racially/ ethnically underrepresented in medicine or dentistry (as defined by each site);
- comes from an economically or educationally disadvantaged background;
- has demonstrated an interest in issues affecting underserved populations.
