ACKERLEY "LEARNING TO LEAD TOGETHER" SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

UW undergraduate students working in teams of 2-5 individuals may apply as a group for a team award to develop a project that supports their leadership development and addresses an important social issue. All team members must be full-time UW undergraduates during the award period. Teams will identify all sources of funding and other resources available to their project (community, campus, fiscal, and personal).

WHAT IS THE APPLICATION PROCESS?

The application consists of: 1) a group project description, 2) individual personal statements from each group member, 3) a project budget and budget justification, 4) a letter of support from the project mentor, and 5) unofficial transcripts from each group member. In addition to the group and individual statements, each group is required to identify a project mentor to write a letter of support and sign off on expenses submitted on the proposal budget sheet.

WHAT IS THE TIMELINE FOR THE AWARD?

The award will be granted for the quarter following the application deadline, with the option of being renewable for one additional quarter, depending on project requirements and progress. In the 2013/14 academic year, there will be one application cycle, with funding occurring in Winter quarter and renewals available for Spring quarter. All selected groups are expected to present at the Spring Celebration of Service and Leadership on May 20, 2014.

WHAT IS THE AWARD?

This award will include a \$1000 scholarship to each team member and up to \$1500 in total project expenses (each team must submit a complete budget and budget justification for approval). Teams making satisfactory progress toward their goals may apply to renew the scholarship portion of the award at \$500 per team member for one additional quarter.

WHAT TYPE OF SUPPORT WILL BE OFFERED TO THE TEAM WINNING THE GRANT?

A Center for Experiential Learning and Diversity staff educator will coach teams and provide leadership instruction and support.
