



THE HARRY S. TRUMAN SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION

The Truman Scholarship provides up to \$30,000 in funding to students pursuing graduate degrees in public service fields. Students must be college juniors at the time of selection. The Foundation also provides assistance with career counseling, internship placement, graduate school admissions, and professional development. Scholars are invited to participate in a number of programs — Truman Scholar Leadership Week, The Summer Institute, The Truman Fellows Program, and the Public Service Law Conference.

Qualities of Nominees:

- Should have a history of involvement in public and community service,
- Committed to careers in government or elsewhere in the public sector
- A wish to influence public policies,
- Outstanding leadership potential, and
- Possess intellectual strength, communication skills, and analytical abilities.

To be considered for nomination as a Truman Scholar, a student must:

- Be a full-time student pursuing a bachelor's degree with junior-level academic standing or am a senior and a resident of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, or a Pacific Island.
- A U.S. citizen (or a U.S. national from a Pacific Island) or expect to receive citizenship by the date the Scholarship will be awarded.
