

Presentation Rubric

Each group member will receive the same grade for all areas except the last one, which will be graded on an individual basis.

Presentations should be 8-10 minutes with 2 minutes for questions.

Each item is graded out of 5 points for a total of 50 points.

- 1 = Poor. Lacks effort. Poor execution. Things are absent or very unclear.
- 2 = Effort was good and most requirements are met, but execution needs a lot of work.
- 3 = Pretty good. Expectations are met, but still a lot of room for improvement.
- 4 = Good! Good effort and well executed, small room for improvement.
- 5 = Great! Well executed. Only very minor improvement needed.

Presentation	Points
Clear introduction and background. Concise, clear explanations of key concepts. Presenters show an understanding of the material.	
Presenters show an understanding of the questions their research is trying to answer and they successfully convey this to audience.	
Presenters provide a clear explanation of what their results are. Include figures/plots and explain these results.	
Results are discussed in the context of the specific research question as well as the “bigger picture” questions. Presenters discuss possible shortcomings of their work and/or future work to be done.	
Met timing restrictions and fielded questions well.	
Structure and Clarity Slides	Points
Slides were well organized and clear. Good balance of text and figures.	
Organization of the talk made sense—good flow.	
All figures had a purpose and were chosen well to make their desired point. All figures were easily readable by the audience.	

Speaking	Points
Partners talked an equal amount of time	
Presenter spoke clearly and confidently. Did not read from slides and kept the audience engaged.
