NEW STUDENT PROGRAMS

Offers information on Freshman Seminars and Freshman Interest Groups (FIGs). Students may apply to be peer instructors for credit. This office runs orientation for freshmen and transfers, hiring students to work as Leaders.

Administers placement tests for math, some foreign languages, and for English as a Second Language. Also provides information regarding other standardized testing.

UW Extension

Evening Degree

If closed out of a critical course, day students may be able to take an evening section through the Evening Degree without paying a separate fee. Evening Degree classes are listed in the back of the time schedule. Day students are eligible to register for open classes on the first day of the quarter.

Distance Learning/Correspondence

Provides selected course work for degree by correspondence.

Offers more than 30 non-degree certificate programs on a wide range of topics, including real estate, records management, and computer graphics.
