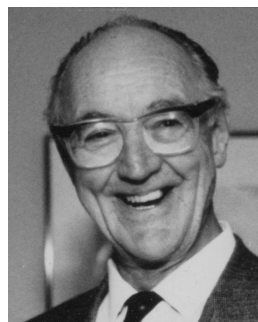

John Butler, M.D.

(November 28, 1923 - May 3, 1992)

Dr. John Butler was born and raised in UK, and obtained his MB. ChB. in 1946 from the University of Birmingham. In 1958, he was awarded a Rockefeller traveling fellowship to the United States. In 1960, he joined Dr. Julius Comroe at the Cardiovascular Research Institute in San Francisco. In 1965, Dr. Butler was appointed Head of the Division of Respiratory Diseases at the University of Washington, Seattle, a position he held for the next 20 years. Under his leadership, the pulmonary division grew from one person to 28 full-time faculty members. He made numerous scientific contributions in the field of pulmonary and critical care medicine, and physiology. He trained many physicians and several of them now occupy prominent positions in the USA and several foreign countries.

Richard K. Albert, M.D.

(Recipient of the **Leonard D. Hudson Lifetime Achievement Award** for 2009)

Dr. Albert received his undergraduate education at the University of Wisconsin, Madison; as well as University of Colorado, Boulder. He received his medical degree from University of Colorado, residency training in internal medicine at the University of Colorado as well as University of Washington, and pulmonary fellowship training at the University of Colorado. In 1976, he was recruited by Drs. John Butler and Leonard Hudson in the Division of Pulmonary and Critical Care medicine at the University of Washington. From 1990 to 1997, he served as the Section Head, Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine, at the University of Washington Medical Center, Seattle, Washington. Since 1997, Dr. Albert has been Chief, Department of Medicine in Denver Health Medical Center (formerly known as the Denver General Hospital). He is also Professor and Vice-Chair, Department of Medicine, University of Colorado, and Adjunct Professor of Engineering and Computer Science, University of Denver. Dr. Albert has received numerous honors and awards notably Alpha Omega Alpha, American Society for Clinical Investigation, Physician Appreciation Award from the Colorado Society for Respiratory Care, Outstanding Instructor, Internal Medicine, and First Prize from British Medical Association Medical Book Competition for *Clinical Respiratory Medicine* (Second Edition, 2005). He has published almost 200 research papers, 43 book chapters and has authored/co-authored 7 text books in pulmonary/critical care medicine. He has been a recipient of many research grants and has served in Editorial Boards of several reputable medical journals.

We dedicate this symposium to Dr. Albert for his numerous contributions to pulmonary/critical care medicine.
