 (1) The Jackson School has applied for a new system of course prefixes and numbers that will affect every course in its curriculum, to be effective in Autumn Quarter 2012. This application updates references to specific course numbers where they appear in the catalog requirements for the program named above. These catalog changes will be effective concurrent with the new course numbering scheme (Autumn 2012) (2) In spring 2011 the Jackson School curriculum committee asked the five regional/area programs to add globally-focused coursework to their requirements where appropriate and desirable. Accordingly, the European Studies faculty voted to require that to one of the three major electives (requirement #4) be a globally focused International Studies course chosen from an approved list (see attachment).
