(Verbs)

I eat bread.	Inknash <u>tkwátasha</u> saplíl.
He eats meat.	Pánk <u>itkwátaxa</u> nákwátnan.
She eats fish.	Íchi áyat <u>itkwátaxa</u> tkwínatnan.
We eat berries.	Namáknatash <u>átkwatxa</u> tmaanítnan.
They eat now.	Pmák <u>patkwátata</u> íchi íkuk.
Will you eat?	Míshnam <u>tkwátata</u> ?
Why do you not eat?	Míshnam cháw <u>tkwátasha</u> ?
I go now.	Áwnash <u>wínasha</u> íchi íkuk.

Will you not go away?	Cháwnam wíyat <u>wínata</u> ?
I stand up.	Inknash <u>tútita</u> .
I stood up.	Inknash <u>tkáchayksh</u> .
We stand up.	Namátkk <u>tútita</u> .
