(Verbs)

You stand up.	Ínknam <u>tútita</u> .
I will stand up.	Ínknash <u>tútixa</u> .
You will not stand up.	Cháwnam ímk <u>tútita</u> .
Why do you not stand?	Míshnam cháw ímk <u>tútisha</u> ?
I drink now.	Ínknash áw chíisha.
You drink water.	Ímk <u>chíik</u> chíish.
I (he, she) love you.	Ínkmash <u>átawisha</u> imanák. <u>Átawishamash</u> imanák.
Do (he, she, I) you love me?	Míshnam <u>pá'atwisha</u> inák?
They have loved him.	Pmák <u>pa'átawisha</u> pinák.
We will love him	Namáknaatk <u>áwatawisha</u> pinák.
