Shix maytski (Shix may-ts-ki) Good morning. This greeting is used during early morning to about 10:00 A.M.

Shix kwlaawit (Shix kw-laa-wit) Good evening. This is a greeting used for evening or nighttime.

You may greet different kinds of people: x I tway (extended family relative, like your cousins and friend); siks(peer, playmate, partner, acquaintance); When someone says

"Siks-in pawa Chaan ku Chaali." John and Charley are partners. "Siks-ma pawa awinsh-ma." The men are acquaintences.

ma = phiral

"I-papa siks-isha Maali ku Kaati i n. Mary and Kathryn are becoming acquainted." They mean, John and Charley are playmates/ partners while they play games. Mary and Kathryn are getting acquainted because they were strangers before they met each other. Siks becomes a verb in the latter.

SIKS is a new word in our vocabulary. - peer, not really close.
