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REVIEWING COMMON VERB PREFIXES

There are eight Sahaptin common pronimal verb prefixes:

- third person, present tense, singular 1. jhe went to the river. i-winana wána-kan.
- 2. third person, plural, awinsh-ma pa-winana wana-kan. The men went to the river.
- 3. á- - áwthird person, absolutive áwinana ámin wana-kan. the woman and her husband went to theriver.
- 4. páinverse pá-twanana ásham-in. The man's wife followed him
- 5. patá pat third prson, plural/dual, subject with third person object ayat-ma pat ákuukyan-ya. The women cooked for him.
- 6. singular, reflexive piná-twakushi-sha ayat. the woman is brushing her own hair.
- 7. pimá plural reflexive ayat-ma pima twanp-shana. the women were combing their own hair.
- 8. pápa reciprocal awinshma pápa-tiwi-sha. The men are fighting each other.
