Vocabulary

wanik-	verb= 'to give a name to' someone or something.
wanikt	N=(noun) the 'name' of something.
ttawax-	verb= 'to grow' (like a plant).
ttawaxt	N.= means heritage, family tree, generation.
miima	adj.= 'old, ancient, worn out'
laymut	adj.= 'youngest sibling'
kaatnam	adj. tall(height), long(length)
k'puul	adj. short (having little height) <u>not</u> for length.

K'puul refers to one shorter than average (5'3" or less)

wap'a-	verb=to weave (weave a cornhusk bag) (weave a blanket)
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kuuki-	verb=to cook raw food.
kuukiła	N.= a person who cooks food.
ichna	adv.=here
chnamank	adv.=from here, from this place(not from somewhere else).

am	N.= husband
asham	N.=wife
