A LEGEND ABOUT THE LITTLE DIPPER

According to some Indian legends, the *Chief, The Star That Does Not Walk Around*, guided the movements of the other stars. This star is the Polaris (North Star). He also watches over the earth and its people and was considered to be the from chief of the constellation called the *Council of Chiefs*.

Tiinma pa-natxana-xa, kwnak tux+n-pa iwa + shch + t t'yawyl-mami. I-waniksha Pash-Ischchit, Milky Way, anaku wak'ishwit-nan pa-w i slawayla-xa tinaynakt-knik xayx-kan, Iwa s+i nwit, ankuu wiyat'ish tiin-ma i-payuwixa-anaku chawiyat pa-tl'yawi-shata, p+i nmink wak'ishwit wiyat'ish awiyaninx-a, anakwaal iwa Plash-Ischchit. Ku anakwmak !+kk+p pa-tl'yawyl-ta, tupan patuxnat-pa, uu-mish pa-wiyawk-ta, k+tu awinaxa wak'ishwit xwiimi-kan.

Tl'apxi-na tiln-ma chaw n+wiit ashukwaa-sha xaslu-nan tamashwikt, kutya niimi nch'inch'i-ma pa-sapk'itwanxa ititamat anwikt, sapalwit, ku lk'w'it. Awanik-sha "Ititamat" taxus-nmi(Indian Calendar).
