FAMILY MEDICINE RiverStone Health Montana Family Medicine Program Dr.Zach Meyers	Each student will participate in full spectrum care in the Family Medicine clerkship which will consist of three, two-week experiences. You will spend two weeks in a community based, Family Medicine ambulatory office practice, two weeks in an active Community Health Center, and two weeks on a busy hospital based Family Medicine teaching service. You will have an opportunity to engage in <u>hands-on</u> procedures at all the clinic sites and the Sports Medicine clinic. You will provide total spectrum, full life cycle care for babies, children, adolescents, women's health, management of multiple chronic and acute illnesses care for all ages and genders. MEDICINE Billings Clinic Dr. Steven Gerstner St. Vincent Healthcare	Students participate in the care of both hospitalized and ambulatory patients; refine the skills of history-taking and physical examinations, and to learn to care for a variety of illnesses. Daily rounds and conferences are held. For each core curriculum topic we expect you to see at least one patient with the topic, and hope you will develop the knowledge and judgment necessary to manage a patient presenting with this problem.

Some learning activities at each site are preplanned; however, many activities are left for each student to plan and develop in the manner in which they best learn. <b>PEDIATRICS</b> <i>Billings Clinic</i> <i>Dr. Brian Starr</i> <i>The Children's Clinic</i> <i>Dr. Marian Kummer</i>	This clerkship offers excellent outpatient volumes which will expose you to a variety of general pediatrics. You will be exposed to the foundational diseases and conditions. Also included is a significant amount of child maintenance and well care, which will show you the normal growth and development, routine behavioral issues, and anticipatory guidance. The total number of outpatients seen during the six week clerkship will be 300 to 400 encounters. You will also get a chance to observe subspecialty clinics staffed by the outreach physicians from Denver Children's Hospital.		
<b>PSYCHIATRY</b> <i>Mental Health Center</i> <i>Dr. Tom Van Dyk</i>	The overall goal of the clerkship is to provide an excellent introduction to clinical Psychiatry including supervised clinical experiences, clinical teaching, and a structured didactic program. This experience provides a large and diverse collection of treatment modes. SURGERY <i>Billings Clinic</i> <i>Dr. Terry Housinger</i> <i>St. Vincent Healthcare</i> <i>Dr. Jeff Rentz</i>	This clerkship will be a side-by-side working environment between students and their preceptors as well as give students a broad base of exposure to the diversity of general surgery and involvement in all the main areas of general surgery. This is an intense experience with days structured to include time in the operating room, time in the office, and time on the wards making rounds and didactic lectures. You will be involved in all aspects of patient care from the initial contact with the patient through their operative experience and postoperative recovery. We organize the first orientation to the Billings Track, assist with housing, and communicate with UW Clerkship offices consistently. Any and all questions are welcomed!		
Orientation	For track students, there is a mandatory orientation at the Billings Track Office located at RiverStone Health on the first Monday of the rotation. The start time is <b>8:00am</b> and is located on the second floor. A light breakfast is provided and it will last about 4 hours which includes tours of the facilities. Any following clerkships will begin with an orientation meeting with the clerkship director.
