Objectives:

At the completion of this clerkship, students should be able to:

- Goal 1 Perform directed histories and physicals, including menstrual history, pelvic exams, breast exams, pap smears and cervical cultures.
- Goal 2 Diagnose and outline a management plan for gynecological problems and diseases.
Describe important (because of impact or commonness) gynecologic problems and their solutions.
Explain the natural course of important gynecological diseases and how each is managed.
Describe major types of family planning techniques, including side effects.
Discuss normal and abnormal gynecologic endocrinology, including menopause.
- Goal 3 Diagnose and manage common obstetrical conditions.
Diagnose pregnancy.
Explain the physiology of pregnancy as it affects the mother and the fetus.
Outline adequate prenatal and postnatal care, including patient education.
Identify the effects of medical and surgical problems on pregnancy and discuss their management.
Manage normal labor and delivery.
Describe types of abnormal labor and delivery, and appropriate management procedures.
Describe principles of obstetric genetic counseling.
- Goal 4 Identify major psychosocial problems and resources available.
Appreciate psychosocial and sexual problems of female patients and families.

Transportation:	2007 Subaru Impreza Car is shared by all OB/GYN clerkship students. With a UAA student ID (WolfCard), students can ride the Anchorage PeopleMover bus system for free. With WolfCard and payment of \$48 (semester) fee, students can use the UAA Wells Fargo Sports Complex facilities.

This clerkship site operates under the direction of Dr. Karen McCreary. The Providence Hospital in Anchorage, Alaska is used as the main teaching hospital. The maternity center couples a family oriented staff with a sophisticated high tech facility, working closely with the neonatal intensive care unit.

In-hospital patient care is under the direct supervision of the preceptor physician. The clinical faculty is board-certified specialists. The student is assigned to a preceptor. The preceptor and student coordinate their schedules, which include biweekly morning conferences, office hours, biweekly evening lectures, labor and delivery call, and surgery. The students make up their own call schedule for labor and delivery. The schedule includes 24-hour call every third day for the first half of the rotation that may decrease as the clerkship progresses.

The Boise, Idaho, clerkship is under the direction of Dr. Scott Christensen. The medical students spend three weeks in clinic hours in a physician's office and three weeks in the labor and delivery room at St. Luke's Regional Medical Center. Each student is assigned to one of the doctors for a review of history and physicals and for rounds. The students assist in surgery, deliveries, and work in the clinic throughout their clerkship.

Students will need to arrange orientation at their respective hospital(s). Dr. Davies will be in e-mail contact with you several weeks before the beginning of your rotation to instruct you on the details of arranging your orientation. In general, if there is one student assigned he/she will be in Caldwell and when two are assigned one student will be at each site.

Sandpoint Women's Health is a single specialty OB/GYN group practice located in Sandpoint, Idaho. There is also a Thursday satellite obstetrics clinic in Bonners Ferry, Idaho, 40 miles to the north of Sandpoint. The clerkship is designed so that the student spends most of their time at the Sandpoint site where all physicians participate in medical student education.

Dr. Bruce Honsinger is the site coordinator. Our clinic is the only OB/GYN practice serving the town of Sandpoint. We work closely with family practice and specialty physicians in our town. Together we provide women's health services to Sandpoint and the surrounding area, including Bonner and Boundary Counties. Sandpoint is in the tip of the Idaho Panhandle, 65 miles south of the Canadian border. Nestled on the northwest shore of 43-mile long Lake Pend Oreille at an elevation of 2,070 feet, it is surrounded by the Selkirk and Cabinet mountains and has a population of 8,900. Sandpoint provides medical services to approximately 60,000 people in the surrounding counties.

There is a telephone, television, cable, and wireless internet as well as a desktop with internet. There is a washer and dryer in the house but you need to have your own detergent. Meals are not provided, but the grocery store isn't too far away. Meals at the hospitals are at a reduced price for University of Washington students. Please show your UW Student ID at the checkout and you will get the employee discount.
Transportation:	A personal automobile is required, as transportation is not provided. You will be within walking distance of the hospital but not the out-patient clinic. A bike is highly recommended but not provided at this time.

Billings is a city of approximately 90,000 people located in the Yellowstone Valley. Billings serves as a medical hub for a radius of 350 miles, encompassing eastern Montana, northern Wyoming, and the western Dakotas. This clerkship, coordinated by Dr. Tersh McCracken, is based at the Deaconess Billings Clinic and composed of a multispecialty physician group practice and 272-bed JCAHO-accredited hospital. The WWAMI clerkship will take place in the Obstetrics and Gynecology Department at Deaconess Billings Clinic. This busy, seven-physician office offers a wide range of basic and specialized services including infertility evaluations, microsurgical procedures, and high-risk obstetrics with amniocentesis and ultrasound services. Gynecologic care includes gynecologic urology and oncology. Students will rotate among physicians, residents, and at Intermountain Planned Parenthood. The Family Birth Center at Deaconess Billings Clinic opened in 1999, providing the community with a single-room maternity care unit with the newest technology for mothers, newborns, and their families. Students in Billings for OB/GYN clerkships share a two-bedroom furnished apartment located approximately three miles from DBC. A car is required.

Bozeman Montana is located in the mountains of southwest Montana and is the home of Montana State University. Our community of 35,000 (plus 12,000 MSU students during the school year) is the fastest growing of all Montana towns and cities. Our outstanding outdoor recreational opportunities are a magnet to people of all ages and all walks of life across the United States. (Bring along your bike, backpack, and canoe!) Our OB/GYN clinic merged with the Billings Clinic on January 1, 2005, bringing to Bozeman a vast array of medical expertise and clinical research activities. We are committed to healthcare, education, and research.

At Bozeman OB/GYN, we have 8 board certified physicians, all of whom are fellows in the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and 3 mid-level providers. Our newest physician joined us in September, 2008. As a whole, Billings Clinic delivers 20% of Montana's babies each year. In Bozeman, our hospital cases are treated at Bozeman Deaconess Hospital, a not-for-profit community hospital. Our call schedule begins at 8 AM each day and runs for 24 hours. You will be assigned call typically 4–5 times a month. Our office hours are 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM daily - no nights, weekends, or holidays.

Our clinic is located on the Bozeman Deaconess Hospital campus at 925 Highland Boulevard, Suite 1210. Our phone number is 406-587-9202. Going east or west on I-90, take exit 309 to Main Street. Turn left at the intersection of Highland Boulevard and East Main Street. (Our campus sits on the hill to your left). Enter the parking lot at the second entrance.

The OB/GYN rotation in Havre will be with the only OB GYN provider in the group practice at Northern Montana Medical Center. The setting is a rural practice environment. The hospital, Northern Montana Hospital, is the only hospital in the community, and serves the 10,000 residents in the town of Havre and also the 16,000 surrounding sq miles for a total of about 30,000 patients. The hospital is a 49-bed facility. The obstetrical unit is an LDRP set up.

The OB GYN rotation will be in addition to the existing, longstanding Family Medicine rotation, which has been very popular.

The town of Havre is close to the Bear Paw Mountains, 40 miles from the Canadian border, and 3 1/2 hours from Glacier National Park. Amtrak provides daily service to Havre.

Two former UW residents, Drs. Janice Givler and Mark Garnaas, direct the Missoula clerkship. Students will be working with four different obstetricians and gynecologists who practice at the Western Montana Clinic, a multispecialty clinic in Missoula. There are two hospitals in the area: Missoula Community Medical Center and St. Patrick's Hospital. The majority of students' time will be spent at the former as all of deliveries in Missoula take place there. Surgery will be done at both facilities. Students will be offered a wide variety of experiences during their clerkship, including surgery and infertility. Students will be assigned to call every fourth or fifth night and one or two weekends.

OB/GYN 665 P- Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, UH/HMC (*, max 12)

Orientation & Preceptor Appointments:

On the first day you will attend a general OB/GYN basic clerkship orientation, followed by an introduction to the UWMC/HMC site. Service assignments, clinic, lecture and call schedules are distributed at this time. All 665 students spend three weeks on GYN Non-Tumor at University Medical Center or the GYN service at Harborview Medical Center. Students with a strong interest in a particular GYN service may request specific assignments by calling the Ob/Gyn Education Office (543-3891) not later than two weeks prior to the first rotation day. Requests will be honored as scheduling allows.

The orientation schedule includes time for students to contact their assigned first period preceptor to arrange regular meeting times (averaging an hour per week). In the third week of the rotation, students should contact their second period preceptor to make similar meeting arrangements.

Clinical Experience

Each student is assigned to either a resident or an attending throughout the rotation. The student accompanies the assigned physician as she/he sees patients and performs parts of the history and physical as directed. All physicians see patients with the student, and together do the work up and decide on patient care. Of the three weeks on the OB service, one week is night float; the other two are on Labor & Delivery and in OB clinics.

Ward work and workups of in-hospital patients are done under the supervision of residents and/or faculty attending. (A good plan is to decide what you would do for the patient, based on information you have gathered, then ask the resident staff or faculty attending for confirmation or constructive criticism of your management plan. You learn more, and remember longer, by being a proactive part of the process.) Much of the teaching is done by residents; in return students provide considerable help to the residents' care of patients, but this too is a learning experience. (Ask why the tests or procedures are done and what the options are for each patient.)

On-Call Responsibility

Each student has one "night float" of call. Night float consists of five nights of call with no clinical responsibilities the following day (however, there are required didactics on Wednesdays). Night float will start on the 1st day of the rotation. The first student on night float will be notified via email prior to their orientation.

Students on call need to establish a helpful and cooperative rapport with the Labor and Delivery staff and need to be available. Students who are readily available in the delivery area accomplish far more hands-on activity than those who are difficult to locate. Meals are not supplied during call.

OB/GYN 669 P- Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Swedish (*, max 12)

Dr. Allen South would like to welcome you to Swedish Medical Center/First Hill. Dr. South will be your primary liaison person with the University of Washington.

Unlike many of the other clerkship sites, Swedish is a private hospital, and this fact has both good and bad aspects. The good news is that you will receive a tremendous amount of direct supervision from practicing Obstetricians/Gynecologists who will always be available to teach you. Overall, you should receive a very clear picture of what the day-to-day practice of obstetrics and gynecology is. The bad news is that, on average, the hands-on obstetrics experience is relatively low. However, if we can judge by the performance of past Swedish students on the final examinations, you will learn at least as much basic Ob/Gyn as do the students at any of the other sites.

OB/GYN 670 P- Introduction to Obstetrics/Gynecology, GH-Central (*, max 12)

While in the Ob/Gyn Clinic, students will be assigned to a staff physician, initially observing and then performing patient interviews, pelvic exams, office obstetrical care and pre-surgical work ups. In addition students will assist in surgery and attend postoperative hospital rounds at Virginia Mason. Students will have the opportunity to observe minor surgical procedures at the Group Health Outpatient Surgical Center. Effort will be made to assign each student to a limited number of physicians in the clinic to facilitate rapport and enable the physician to monitor student progress throughout the rotation.

While on the Labor & Delivery rotation, the student will be assigned to the obstetrical staff physician on call, who will be responsible for having the student observe from one to three deliveries per day. Depending on the total exposure of the student, and his/her ability, the student may be able to provide some deliveries, with or without episiotomy or laceration repair. Students will attend morning ward rounds with the attending and the family practice residents. Students will also have the opportunity to observe the Antepartum testing unit, lactation consults with our Lactation Consultants and patient interviews with our Medical Social Workers.

Students will be expected to take overnight call every seventh night including at least one 24-hour weekend shift. Students will be asked to create a schedule after starting the rotation.

OB/GYN 672 P- Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, GH-East (*, max 12)

Offered:	A(A), W(A), Sp(B); 6 weeks

This course is an introductory experience in the provision of comprehensive medical care and counseling services to adult and adolescent female patients. Obstetrical conditions and gynecologic problems commonly encountered by the physician provide the primary focus.

The initial orientation to the clerkship is at the University of Washington, followed by a scheduled on-site orientation. Clerkship final examinations are also at the University of Washington.

During their rotation at Group Health Eastside, students will be assigned to both the Ob/Gyn Clinic at the new Bellevue Medical Center office as well as the Labor and Delivery unit at Overlake Hospital in alternating one-week blocks. During the Ob/Gyn Clinic blocks, students will be assigned to one permanent staff physician each week. Under this guidance, the students will observe the process of medical care in the clinic and be introduced to pelvic examinations, patient interviews, etc. They will take histories and perform physicals, including the pelvic examination. Students will also go to surgery with their assigned physician. They will do a complete pre-surgical workup and assist the attending surgeon at surgery. On the Labor and Delivery blocks of rotation, the students will be assigned to the Labor and Delivery unit to follow the patients in labor and delivery. Depending on the total exposure and ability of the individual student, students may be able to perform some deliveries, with or without episiotomy repair. While on the Delivery Service, students will be expected to remain until 11:00 p.m. when on call (every 3rd night and weekend day).

Students are also required to present one topic (as outlined in the Clerkship brochure) at an arranged conference at the site. Students will attend the Ob/Gyn teaching rounds and conferences at the University on Wednesday mornings; as well as clerkship lectures, most of which are also scheduled for Wednesday mornings.

Students will be evaluated on their performance in surgery, delivery room and clinic; on their presentation and patient workups; and on their oral and written final examination taken at the University of Washington.

Valley Women's Clinic was established in 1976 by Drs. Glen Patchen, Melvin Lake and Wellington Manullang. Since that time, our providers have changed but our compassion and goal of quality medical care for the women of South King County has not.

Our main clinic, located in Renton, Washington, is conveniently located across the street from Valley Medical Center. We also have a full time satellite office in Covington, one of King County's fastest growing suburbs.

Our hospital of choice for surgeries and deliveries is Valley Medical Center (www.valleymed.org). VMC has a brand new LDRP Birth Center, as well as a Level III nursery. In addition, the hospital has 24 hour in-house neonatology and anesthesia coverage, as well as full time perinatology, reproductive endocrinology and gynecologic oncology specialists.

Currently, call is shared equally amongst five physicians. Weekend call is rotated with local Multicare Physicians OBGYN group.

	(some seasonal) are on location. There is On-site Management, Laundry Facilities, close to Major Shopping & Entertainment and Bus Line. Apartments are located 2.5miles from Sacred Heart Medical Center, so vehicle is necessary in Spokane. Apartments have 2 bedrooms, 1 1/2 baths, kitchen & living area. This clerkship, coordinated by Dr. Hopkins, occurs primarily at the Sacred Heart Medical Center where students will participate in day and night shifts and attend an OB clinic. Some students will take night call with their attending at Valley Hospital, Deaconess Medical Center, or Holy Family Hospital. Students will work with one of eight OB/GYN preceptor groups at their office. While assigned to the office, the preceptor will determine the student's night call schedule. When assigned to Sacred Heart Medical Center, students will work with an OB fellow and will have scheduled nights on call. Students should expect to work some Saturdays and Sundays that consist of a 24-hour call.

The site coordinator for the Tacoma OB/GYN clerkship is Dr. John Lenihan. Tacoma Women's Specialists is a single specialty private practice OB-GYN group practicing in North Tacoma across the street from Tacoma General Hospital, a level III regional perinatal center. Their office has four physicians, two nurse practitioners, and a staff of fifteen nurses and other employees. Their physicians usually spend two half days each week in the operating room and the rest of the time in the office seeing patients. Each provider has one day off a week. Call schedule is usually every fourth night and fourth weekend. Call is shared with other community OB-GYN's who work at Tacoma General Hospital. Obstetrics is only done at Tacoma General, however surgery is performed at both hospitals. The office sees a large volume of primary care and referral OB-GYN patients. They manage virtually all areas specific to women's health including infertility and oncology and have in-office ultrasound, urodynamics, colposcopy, and other treatment capabilities. During the rotation, students will be spending most of their time with Dr. Lenihan. They will also be working with other physicians when Dr. Lenihan is not available or while they are on call. Call is every fourth night and one weekend a month.

As the major medical center in this region the doctors of the Women's Clinic follow high risk obstetrics patients and participate in infertility treatment. The Women's Clinic in Walla Walla will have four students participate in the educational program each year.

Walla Walla is located at the foot hills of the Blue Mountains in eastern Washington's wine country. Walla Walla's downtown has been nominated one of the best for small towns of the United States. Whitman College, Walla Walla Community College and Walla Walla University attract a large spectrum of speakers and performing arts. Rock Springs is the largest town in southwestern Wyoming. The clerkship site is coordinated by Dr. Kaan and is located at the College Hill Women's Health Care Center, a referral and service center for almost a quarter of the state and the only provider of obstetric services in the area. Likewise, Sweetwater Memorial Hospital is the only hospital in the county. The student clerkship will provide many opportunities for both obstetrics and gynecology. Students will work with three board-certified physicians and will rotate between outpatient clinic, labor and delivery, operating suites, and medical-surgical inpatient areas. There are many other learning opportunities available for students, including laboratory, emergency medicine, family planning, etc. No set call schedule exists, although students are expected to spend several nights following patients in labor and delivery.

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
