Our units focus on providing direct services and support to students, their families and the community. Whether they know it or not, students come in contact with our offices and staff multiple times a day when they eat in the dining facilities, work out at the IMA, register for classes, or attend an evening campus event.

Access

We promote access by working to remove barriers and by creating opportunities which allow students to take advantage of all the UW has to offer

Student Care

We provide programming, services and outreach that are proactive, educational and responsive to students' well-being and success.

Engagement

Student Life produces environments and experiences that result in students' personal growth, social connection and strong investment in campus life and the UW.

6,000 students housed in residence halls, apartments, and family housing

2,000 programs and activities offered to residential students by Housing & Food Services

13,452 total attendees at Career Center events; **384** total events

51,350 students and family member participants in academic ceremonies produced by the Office of Ceremonies

14,000 newspapers distributed each day by Student Publications; **63,000** readers online per month

772 Registered Student Organizations advised by Student Activities and Union Facilities

3,500 members in Fraternity and Sorority Life;

32 fraternities, **17** sororities
