### TRIO TRAINING

### TRIO QUEST

This will also allow access to eTRIO Resources.</i>
<b>MediaQuest</b>	A free activity for all TRIO students in all TRIO Programs to share their vision by creating and uploading individual audio and video projects.
<b>PhotoEssay</b>	A free activity that provides a short, simple, creative activity open to all TRIO students in all TRIO programs in which students create their own individual PhotoEssay.
<b>TRIO ThinkQuest</b>	A free activity open to pre-college students ages 12-19 who are active participants in an Upward Bound, Talent Search Program, or EOC Program. Students work in teams of three to six to build Web sites that can be used as learning tools by other students.
<b>Oracle ThinkQuest International</b>	Information and resources for TRIO students and coaches to help them enter their websites into the ThinkQuest International Competition.

## TRIO TRAINING

University of Washington TRIO Training offers free onsite and online training under two different priorities:

- **Priority 1:** Record keeping, performance reporting [APRs], and project evaluation
- **Priority 3:** Student needs assessment, proven retention and graduation strategies, and the effective use of educational technology

### Free Onsite Trainings

Follow the *Onsite Trainings* link and fill out the **Onsite Training Application**.

These trainings are open to all TRIO professionals from all TRIO programs. You may apply for one or both Priorities. Attendance at the training is approved travel for TRIO programs. There is no registration fee.

### Free Online Training

Follow the *Online Training* link and fill out the **Online Training Application**.

UW TRIO Training online presentations are provided as interactive multimedia presentations with audio and text transcripts on all training topics. Most presentations are recorded at our onsite trainings.

To access the online courses, you'll need to have an account on our online presentation server. TRIO staff who don't have an account can create one by filling out the **Online Training Application** form. Note that this is separate from the application for onsite training. Your username will be your complete email address and you will choose your own password. There is no fee for the online training.

You may view as many presentations as you like. To receive a certificate of completion for a training, you will need to participate in all required courses and then fill out a final evaluation. A list of the online courses currently available is provided at the end of this document.

## TRIO QUEST

TRIO Quest Activities provide educational opportunities for TRIO staff and students that promote the use of today's technology. The four student activities, three of which are only available to members of the TRIO community, are described below. This section contains complete rules and rubrics for each activity, entry instructions and a gallery of past winners dating back to 2001. A wide variety of resources and free tools to support curriculum development and student participation are also provided.

**Note:** *All students and staff participating in TRIO Quest activities will need to Register for a TRIO Quest Account. Instructions are provided.*

### **PhotoEssay**

*Showcases the literary and artistic talent of TRIO students.* PhotoEssay provides a short, simple and free activity open to all TRIO students in all TRIO programs in which students create their own individual PhotoEssay with appropriate support and direction by staff and other advisors.

The PhotoEssay is an effective way to:

- Introduce students to the compelling interaction possible between text and images
- Introduce students to image manipulation
- Provide students a chance to be published on the Web
- Promote a better understanding of intellectual honesty and citation
- Encourage research, reflection, and/or creative work by TRIO students

### **MediaQuest**

*A contest for the YouTube generation.* MediaQuest is a free program for all TRIO students in all TRIO Programs that allows students to use audio or video to share their vision.

MediaQuest activities promote the creative and educational use of multimedia and they provide an effective way to:

- Find and use cost effective multimedia tools
- Understand intellectual honesty including citation and permission for other people's work
- Use multimedia for creative purposes, to present information, and/or to support the presentation of research
- Understand an audience and responsibly produce material that allows effective communication with diverse groups

### **TRIO ThinkQuest**

*A web design competition for TRIO students.* TRIO ThinkQuest is a free activity open to pre-college students ages 12-19 who are active participants in an Upward Bound, Talent Search Program, or EOC Program. Students work in teams of three to six to build Web sites that could be used as learning tools by teachers and other students. TRIO ThinkQuest challenges learners to create high quality, innovative and content-rich educational Web sites that meet high standards of intellectual honesty.

TRIO ThinkQuest is an effective and fun way to:

- Promote learning 21st century research skills and techniques
- Encourage original writing, multimedia content creation, and presentation of educational material
- Create the occasion for students to learn collaboration skills
- Promote an "Internet Style of Learning"

### **Oracle ThinkQuest International**

*An opportunity to submit websites into the International competition.* In partnership with the Oracle Education Foundation, TRIO students are encouraged to submit their websites to the ThinkQuest International Competition (TQI). Information on transitioning to TQI, including resources for coaches and teams and information on how to obtain free Adobe Web Publishing software for students is provided. Links to TRIO sites that have been entered into the International Competition and an inspirational video highlighting the TRIO/Oracle Education Foundation Partnership are also available.

Participation in Oracle ThinkQuest International provides:

- An exciting opportunity to compete and be recognized at an international level
- A chance for students to build their resumes and scholarship applications by participating in this widely recognized and publicized activity
- A chance to win valuable prizes and an all-expenses paid trip to San Francisco
- Additional opportunities to collaborate and learn using 21st Century Skills
