Latin.


Each course offered a variety of academic activities from genetic sequencing, astronomy and exploring "fantasy" literature, to lessons in web site design and college applications.

These classes will help you improve your SAT scores anywhere from 50-200 points in math and/or verbal! Andrew West and Donna Bolima will

be team teaching this course. If by chance your score is above average (above 50 for PSAT verbal and math) then you can apply for the Princeton Review workshops which offers UB scholarships for a \$900.00 workshop. Again, they only accept students whose scores are above average and spots are limited.

Senior Counseling

Fina is in all of the schools every week to meet with Seniors or to help any student with academic needs. She is in Cleveland Monday (SAC room), Hale Tuesday (Library), Franklin Friday (room off Counseling Office). She is there to help —see her if needed!



Some students do not remember that they need two years of the same foreign language to apply to a four-year college. Be conscious of your college requirements and realize that graduation requirements from high school are different than those you need to apply for college. Contact Fina to keep on track before registering for classes and/or if you have academic concerns. You don't want to end up short when you hit college application! If you play it smart, you can finish requirements early!
