DESCRIPTIONS OF ASSIGNMENTS

Research & Presentation Projects: Involves examination of primary and secondary sources for various assignments, as well as

MLA format and citation

Response Write: Involves in-class response and writing for a given issue as on the SAT

Quizzes: Given every other week on concepts, vocabulary and issues covered during the week

Final Exam: Comprehensive Final

Readings: Involves analytical reading of various issues and topics that students can present in discussion

College Prep: Involves essay writing, information gathering and skills building in writing, processing applications and learning to meet deadlines.

Sr Project Research: Involves researching various topics of interest that could be used for student's Sr Project
