The School of Dentistry Faculty Council would like to thank you and President Cauce for the opportunity to respond to the proposed Financial Stability Plan (FSP).

The Faculty Council <u>rejects</u> the FSP. We are concerned that the FSP will not achieve a balanced budget by FY 2017 as proposed, placing the SOD in further financial danger. Attached is a detailed response to the FSP and recommendations based on input from the SOD faculty. We understand there are difficult decisions to be made regarding the SOD budget, but believe the alternative options outlined have a better chance of moving the SOD toward long-term solvency. We also urge you to consider our longer-term recommendations. We respectfully request a written response as soon as possible.
