Time and Movement Study

Dr. John Welsh (Seattle Children's) with UW Autism Center researchers Drs. Annette Estes, Stephen Dager, and Jeff Munson are launching a new project to follow up children in the Infant Brain Imaging Study (IBIS) and Toddler Assessment Project (TAP) between 8 and 12 years of age. We hope that the information gained in this project will provide insight into long-term outcomes of behavioral intervention and help identify underlying neural mechanisms of ASD.
