## Incorporating Autistic Perspective and Principles of Neurodiversity into ABA Practice

Now, more than ever, BCBAs and ABA providers are on a path to provide compassionate, person-centered ABA services. In this webinar, providers will build a foundational understanding about the relationship between the practice of ABA and Neurodiversity. We will also review the history of behavior analysis and current ABA practice through a critical lens.
