Practitioners working with special populations with and without previous experience in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)

What content will be covered?

This rigorous 40-hour* course is designed to provide participants with opportunities to examine and apply instructional strategies utilizing the principles of ABA, collect and analyze student data, and develop intervention and instructional plans based upon data collection. Instruction is delivered onsite in Anacortes and through online sessions through collaboration between UW Autism Center and Northwest Educational Service District 189.

Cost

\$675 per person

*Instruction provided in this course meets the coursework requirements for those pursuing Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) Certification. Other requirements apply and those interested in pursuing this option are encouraged to visit this website for additional requirements: <u>https://bacb.com/rbt/</u>. Pursuit of RBT certification is not required nor is it necessary for educational staff providing instruction utilizing the Principles of Applied Behavior Analysis.
