

The UW Autism Center is actively recruiting participants as part of our collaboration in the multicenter Infant Brain Imaging Study (IBIS). Participants in each of these studies will complete developmental testing, and participate in MRI scans without the use of sedation.

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) is an umbrella term that describes various methods of communication for those who are unable to use verbal speech and/or can be used to supplement communication. Examples are iPads, picture exchange, and dedicated speech devices. Our speech language pathologists (SLPs), **Carly Brukhman** and **Jim Engracia**, attended an AAC collaboration night with fellow AAC specialists and SLPS to discuss different high-tech communication systems and evidencebased treatment strategies.



The UWAC Training Team has been busy the past few months! Throughout September and October the Training Team has partnered with school districts and community agencies in 6 different counties to provide trainings and school consultations. Up next for the Training Team will be *ABA for SLPs* hosted by **James Engracia M.A. SLP-CCC**. In this training participants will learn the basic ins and outs of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and how to incorporate ABA strategies into an SLPs clinical practice.

Learn more The Study of Autism and Self-Regulationat Seattle Pacific University is investigating the self-regulation skills of 3-to 6-year-old children with autism spectrum disorder to learn how these skills are related to adaptive functioning and social-emotional competence. The focus of the current study is on children's ability to regulate their behavior during emotioneliciting events.



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
