# **Upcoming Trainings**

### **ADOS-2 Advanced Research Workshop**

The UW Autism Center is excited to offer workshops on the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule (ADOS-2), a gold standard, autism diagnostic tool. These trainings are designed for researchers and providers with at least a Master's level degree and a background in autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and testing. Workshops are facilitated by Clinical Psychologist and Research Scientist at the University of Washington Autism Center, **Tanya St. John, Ph.D**.



#### January 8-9, 2019 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM UWAC - Seattle Who should attend?

Professionals who want to further their clinical competence with the ADOS-2 and/or work towards establishing research levels of reliability on the administration and coding standards. Individuals planning to use the ADOS-2 in research studies must establish reliability on the measure.

#### What are the prerequisites?

All trainees are expected to have attended an in-person ADOS or ADOS-2 Introductory Clinical Training through UWAC, CADB, UMACC, WPS or an Independent Trainer. Prior to attending, trainees must record themselves administering two modules from the ADOS-2 with individuals who meet criteria on ASD and submit them prior to or bring them to the workshop. Individualized feedback on these recorded administrations will be provided by the trainer. Completion of the pre-course recordings is a key step in achieving research reliability and prepares trainees for post-course work.

#### What content will be covered?

During this 2-day workshop, trainees will work with an experienced trainer and will have the opportunity to practice administering and scoring the ADOS-2 modules with typically developing children and those who have ASD. Individualized feedback will be provided on administration and scoring. Upon completion of this workshop, trainees will be provided with additional guideline materials for use in establishing research reliability. The workshop fee includes post-course reliability scoring if submitted within three months of the training date.
