We are excited to announce the IBIS Network is inviting children between 7 and 12 years old to take part in the IBIS School Age Study of brain and behavior development.



During this study you will be asked to do some paper and pencil tests and games. These tests will help us learn about how you think and solve problems. You will be asked to get a picture of your brain called an MRI.

The machine used to take the pictures is big and you will lie down on a bed inside the machine while the pictures are being made. The study will take place at the University of Washington in Seattle over two days. You will be paid up to \$300 for participating and reimbursed for travel related costs.

IBIS School Age Study Overview

Before Visit



Phone Interview

One-hour phone interview with parents including questions about child's medical history, family demographics, and adaptive behaviors.



Digital Surveys

Surveys asking about your child in the study, their sibling, and parents.

In-Person Visit



Behavioral Assessments

Cognitive and behavioral assessments of child with clinical psychologist.



MRI Scan

Child will be able to practice first and then complete an MRI. Child is awake and able to watch a movie during the majority of the scan.

After Visit



Follow-up

Check-in to ensure all parts of study are complete. Feedback report and phone call with parents offering recommendations as appropriate.
