1 AZALEA WAY

Iconic feature of the Arboretum, part of the original Olmsted design. A $\frac{3}{4}$ mile path flanked by azaleas, flowering cherries, dogwoods and magnolias against a backdrop of native conifers

2 WOODLAND GARDEN

Seasonal stream connecting the upper and lower ponds. Rockwork was laid out in 1938. Early spring blooms and delicate branching of Japanese maples. One of the oldest parts of the Arboretum

3 Magnolia species and cultivars

Small to large deciduous and evergreen trees with showy white, cream-yellow or pink flowers. Part of the National Collection

4 Brian Mulligan *Sorbus* Collection Mountain Ash/Whitebeam/Rowan

Small deciduous trees, with varying leaf shapes depending on species, and abundant white or cream flowers

5 RHODODENDRON GLEN

Seasonal stream cascades among naturalistic rockwork among rhododendrons and spring flowers

6 *Camellia* species and cultivars

Broadleaf evergreen shrubs with large and showy flowers of red, pink and white

7 *Stewartia pseudocamellia* and *Stewartia monadelph* *Stewartia*

Small deciduous trees with peeling, dramatic multicolored bark

8 NEW ZEALAND FOREST

Small-leaved broadleaf evergreens of dramatic form against sweeps of grasses over 2.5 acres

9 CHINA ENTRY GARDEN

Epimedium, primroses and other spring flowering plants highlight this portion of the Pacific Connections Garden

10 *Ribes sanguineum* Red-flowering currant

Medium sized deciduous shrubs with hanging flowers in reddish-pink, light pink or white

11 CASCADIA FOREST

This garden features early spring wildflowers native to the Pacific Northwest

12 JAPANESE GARDEN

Authentic, formal 2.5 acre garden admission fee collected

13 THE PINETUM Conifers

Evergreen conifer species from around the world, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile interpretive trail

14 FOSTER ISLAND and ARBORETUM WATERFRONT TRAIL

Collections of oaks, birches and pines, and access to waterfront trail connecting to the Montlake neighborhood and main UW Campus
