### **Thursday, October 20, 2011 ~ Indigenous Peoples and the Idea of Reconciliation 4:00 pm, Communications 120**

State apologies and visions of reconciliation have become a central issue in contemporary Indigenous politics in Australia, New Zealand, the United States, and Canada. In this presentation, **Dale Turner** (Government, Dartmouth College) discusses the evolving idea of Indigenous reconciliation in the context of the recently ratified United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. Turner is Anishinabe and a citizen of the Temagami First Nation on Lake Temagami, Ontario. He is the author of *This is not a peace pipe: Towards a Critical Indigenous Philosophy* (2006).
