The Simpson Center is making a limited number of travel grants (up to \$1000 each) available to UW participants in University of Victoria's acclaimed Digital Humanities Summer Institute, June 4-8, 2012. Grants will underwrite registration, travel, accommodation, and per diem expenses for DHSI participation. Because the Simpson Center sponsors UW participation, DHSI registration fees for UW students and faculty are \$300 and \$650 respectively for the week-long program.

Priority will be given to early career graduate students/scholars from the division of the humanities. Because DHSI courses are filling quickly, *awards will be made on a rolling basis: Apply early!*

The University of Victoria's Digital Humanities Summer Institute (DHSI) has earned a reputation as "the gold standard for Digital Humanities training events." DHSI courses range from Introductory/Fundamentals to Intermediate and Advanced levels, and engage such topics as text encoding, multimedia, GIS, project planning and management, and digitization, as well as digital pedagogy, databases, pre-digital book culture, tools for literary history, and more. Founded in 2001, the DHSI engaged 230 participants from around the globe last year, and has been profiled in the Chronicle of Higher Education.
