

NOTES

I should like to see the theatre of today as the Pool of Siloam from which a man may emerge softened and restored physically. I think that the most wholesome theatre is that in which one can gaily and harmlessly laugh over the stupidity of mankind. It is exactly this stupidity that men consider to be their "fate".

It is extremely helpful for an hour or two to forget this reality which we ourselves create so heedlessly and inconsiderately, and which, in making us collide with one another, easily breaks our hearts and heads.

I have no reason to suppose that the perception and thought of man will for ever remain as it is today. Every muscle develops by use; the tissues of the brain and of the nerves may be subject to the same law.

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

Maxim Gorki (1868-1936), the self-taught author of short stories, verse, fiction, and plays, grew up in impoverished rural Russia. By the time he was thirty years old, he had become a nationally celebrated writer, editor, and radical political figure.

The Lower Depths (Na dne) was Gorki's first produced play, performed at the Moscow Art Theater in 1902. Other works for the stage include The Petty Bourgeois, Summerfolk, Children of the Sun, Enemies, and Barbarians.
