ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Born in London on September 3, 1938, Caryl Churchill is the most successful dramatist to have come out of the British radical theatre movement of the 1960's. Her first theatrical hit after a long apprenticeship in radio and television writing was Cloud Nine (1979), which embodied many of the qualities that continue to distinguish her work: a socialist and feminist point of view; language of great freshness and wit; and the use of original dramatic technique. Fen won the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize in 1983, and both Cloud Nine and Top Girls won Obie awards when they were produced in NY. Other plays include: Serious Money, The Skriker, Vinegar Tom, and Light Shining in Buckinghamshire.
