Chuck Harper - Director

As artistic director of Seattle's Uninvited Artists, Chuck directed Can't Stand Up for Falling Down, The Erpingham Camp, Titanic, and the world premiere of Casey Smith's Frog One at ArtsEdge, Seattle's festival of experimentation in the arts. Chuck was a 1997 recipient of the CEC International Partners' ArtsLink Grant for a Czech/American theatre collaboration which resulted in the European premiere of Doug Wright's Obie Award-winning Ouills. The production was named 1997 Cultural Highlight by The Prague Post and subsequently toured to Berlin. As a long-time ensemble member and associate artistic director of Chicago's Strawdog Theatre Company, his numerous Midwest premieres included Marlane Meyer's Etta Jenks, Alexander Ostrovsky's A Family Affair, Robert A. Wilson's Wilhelm Reich in Hell and Howard Korder's Search and Destroy. In October of 2000 he will be re-locating to Poitiers, France to serve as associate director and resident faculty for the Ardeo Theatre Project. Chuck is a member of the Society of Stage Directors and Choreographers and Actors Equity Association. He is a graduate of the UW School of Drama graduate directing program.
