Common Elements Treatment Approach (CETA) Learning Collaborative Training and Consultation FY 25

What is CETA?

CETA is a cognitive behavioral approach shown to help posttraumatic stress, anxiety, and depression in <u>adults</u>. Common element selection, order, and number of sessions per element are based on presenting symptoms and clinical target.

What are the Common Elements in CETA?

Cognitive Coping; Gradual Exposure – Trauma Memories; Live Exposure; Cognitive Restructuring; Behavioral Activation; Problem Solving; Substance Use Reduction; and Relaxation.

TRAINING COMPONENTS:

Participation is open to mental health providers who provide <u>ongoing mental health treatment to adults 18 y/o+</u> in the state of Washington.

The training and consultation will be delivered by the Harborview/UW team in collaboration with WA CETA Trainer Consultants. Online Live Training Dates:

- November 2024: Nov 18th, 19th, 20th, 2024 (Mon-Wed) 8:30AM 2:30PM each day
- February 2025: Feb 5th, 6th, 7th, 2025 (Wed-Frid) 8:30AM 2:30PM each day

Is my organization eligible? Who should we send to the training?

- · Licensed community mental health centers committed to implementing CETA for eligible clients.
- An organizational CETA trained supervisor must agree to provide ongoing CETA supervision to their participating staff.
 - If the organization has a CETA supervisor on site assigned to provide the CETA supervision, it may send up to 6
 providers who provide therapy to adults.
 - If the organization does not have a trained CETA supervisor on site, it may send a team that includes a clinical supervisor who will provide CETA supervision and two providers who provide therapy to adults.
- Organizations that have not previously attended a CETA Learning Collaborative must have a senior clinical administrator contact Whitney Hellyer (206) 744-1645 prior to acceptance into the training.

What are the requirements of participants attending the Learning Collaborative?

- 1. Attend all 3 live online learning sessions.
- 2. Complete the CETA Certificate requirements:
 - a. Attend at least 8 out of 10 consultation calls.
 - b. Present at least 1 case during the 6-month consultation period
 - c. Deliver CETA to 2 clients; one case must be trauma focused. **Supervisors** who attend the training must deliver CETA to 1 client (Trauma focused case strongly preferred).
- 3. Document cases in our on-line EBP Toolkit.

REGISTRATION NOTES:

- > Only clinical administrators or CETA supervisors may register participants. The supervisor who will be providing ongoing CETA supervision must be named for each participant at the time of registration.
- All registration is done on-line. Registration links will be sent at a later date.
- > There is a fee of \$300/person to participate in this learning collaborative. CEU's are provided for the training series. A Certificate of Completion will be granted upon successful completion of consultation call requirements.
